



BIM Scoping Committee Report
June 13, 2006



Many of the Scoping team members participated in the AIA National Convention in Las Angeles June 6-9. During that conference new members were solicited and some discussions on convergence took place.

One of the National BIM award winners, Orcutt-Winslow Partnership has agreed to give the Scoping team their workflow diagrams for review. Orcutt-Winslow does commercial buildings, medical, and schools.

Recently the Scoping Committee work has focused on these areas with the inclusion of new persons within those areas.

These include:

1. AIA and AIA representatives of TAP that can support architectural views. In order to support a simplified knowledge gathering, an IDM document was created and is in draft form for review. Tony Rinella is reviewing the document, Kristen Fallon, and anyone on the portal.
2. Members of Scoping met with Kristen Fallon, working with NIST on a Handover guide document. In her work she references “information packets” which are similar to IDM. Kristen will be brought onto the Scoping team to harmonize these activities.
3. Chuck Eastman has agreed to develop the exchanges for Concrete and Steel, and will use the IDM worksheets and the Scoping Chart. A discussion on improving the chart by adding a new exchange field happened at the AIA National Conference on BIM and Interoperability.
4. Bill Broadt of NASA and Bob Carlsen met to formulate IDM definitions for Scoping from COBIE. We await this effort.
5. Lamar Hendersen, a LEED certified architect and a member of LEED Committee is working on the LEED requirements.

To date we have received only three comments on the worksheets and no new exchanges from these groups.

The next meeting for the Scoping team will be Friday, June 16 at 1:30PM EST.
